HOT SPOTS

In November 2021, BPL added a wireless hot spot lending service enabling library card holders to have free access to high speed Internet wherever they are.

INN-REACH INTERLIBRARY LOAN

To increase access to materials that are not readily available through RiverShare member libraries, Bettendorf Library card holders can request materials through the library's online catalog to have items shipped from libraries out of state.

STEM & STEAM KITS

In February 2022, the Youth Services Department added 29 STEM & STEAM kits available for checkout. Each kit includes different hands-on activities, experiments, and toys that encourage users to engage in critical thinking and problem-solving as they play.

QC BEATS

In partnership with the Davenport Public Library, St. Ambrose University, Common Chord (formerly River Music Experience) and Planet 93.9 KQCJ, BPL now offers access to an online streaming audio collection featuring local musicians.

SEED LIBRARY

BPL introduced our Seed Exchange Library in May 2022. Patrons are invited to take seeds from our collection and encouraged to harvest and donate seeds back to the library at the end of growing season to build the next year's selection.

GLOBAL GATHERINGS: WORLD TOUR

The 15th year of the Global Gatherings programming series was our largest yet, with over 35 online and in-person events taking participants of all ages on a "World Tour" instead of focusing on one country or region. Global Gatherings will return in 2024.

LIBRARY CARD DESIGN CONTEST

In Spring 2022, library patrons of all ages were invited to submit artwork for a library card design contest. The public voted for their favorite design during the month of June and the winners were made into limited edition cards for National Library Card Sign-Up Month in September.

CREATION STUDIO GRAND OPENING







On October 19th, 2021, the Library finally celebrated the grand opening of the newly expanded Creation Studio on the library's 2nd floor, with remarks from Mayor Bob Gallagher and Bettendorf Library Foundation Vice-President Ann Kappeler.

Today the Creation Studio hosts roughly 10 library-sponsored programs a month and 18 hours of open lab hours each week, encouraging Library users to explore their creativity and learn how to use new emerging technologies. Currently, the Creation Studio has two 3D printers, a heat press, large-format printer, Cricut-Maker, sewing machines, button makers, and more!

SUMMER PROGRAMMING

After a two-year hiatus, the Summer Reading Program and our ever-popular Summer Concert Series returned to our regular programming schedule. 2,712 adults, teens, and children registered for the Summer Reading Program, and 4,305 people attended the 11 Summer Concerts hosted in Faye's Field from June to mid-August. These programs would not be possible without the generous support from the Bettendorf Library Foundation, Friends of the Bettendorf Library, and our many sponsors.





The Bettendorf Public Library Foundation is a nonprofit organization established in 1983 to seek private sector support for maintaining the excellence of programs and services offered by the Bettendorf Public Library. While tax dollars support operation costs, private gifts made through the Foundation help to support innovative new programs and services to meet the community's change needs and interests. The Library Foundation strives to ensure that the Bettendorf Public Library can continue to meet the needs of the community, today and tomorrow.

In FY22, the Library Foundation provided funding for our Global Gathering series, Free Comic Book Day, the Summer Concert Series and Summer Reading Program, as well as machines and tools for our newly renovated Creation Studio.

FY22 FOUNDATION GIFTS: \$56,905

The Friends of the Bettendorf Library are members of a nonprofit organization dedicated to supporting and promoting the Bettendorf Library. The Friends contribute to the purchase of books, materials, programs for all ages, and other expenditures beyond the Library's budget.

In FY21 the Friends opened a book shop in the old café space. In response to increasing public demand, the book shop expanded its hours in FY22 and is now open from 10am-4pm Mondays-Wednesdays and 11am-3pm on Saturdays.

The Friends of the Library provided funding for our first year's subscription fo Kanopy video streaming service; re-upholstering the benches by the fireplace; and sponsored many of our take home crafting kits.
